Program –

Tim Walsworth United way and La Plata Electric Association LPEA Round Up Program

Round Up is a great program, which is supported by LPEA the average donation is .60 cents a month. This program started in 1997 and has since raised right around 1 million dollars. Round up Contributes to the community outreach program which helps with one time emergency loans. Other funds are granted based on application for need within the community. 3 community organizations came to give testimony of how the Round Up helps their organizations. Tim Asks that all Rotarians sign up for Round Up!

Luann – Bluegrass Meltdown it is great that Round UP also supports the arts and we are dedicated to preserving bluegrass. We offer an in school programs that reach about 1000 students each year and promote and preserve Bluegrass music.

Serata – Volunteers of America - Southwest Safe House and the Community Shelter have both benefitted from Round Up funds have purchased screens for the windows and other home improvement projects that otherwise would not have been completed. These 2 shelters serve over 450 men, women and children each year.

Joe Bishop with SOS Outreach – SOS is a mentoring program for 9-R students that uses snowboarding as the carrot to get at risk student engaged in school. SOS hires 18 to 25 year old as mentors the funds received help with scholarship to support the at risk students.
